Updated DoE Guidelines

From 8th November, all schools will operate on updated Level 3 settings for the rest of Term 4, with additional activities allowed in a COVID-safe manner. I have listed the changes below but as always, you can check full details of the advice at the following link: https://education.nsw.gov.au/covid-19/advice-for-families

- Assemblies and Presentations are allowed outdoors on site with cohorts remaining separated through physical distancing. We are currently keeping to zoom assemblies at this stage for ease.
- Fully vaccinated visitors are only allowed onsite if invited to present a special award. Unfortunately this means that we will not be able to have parents attend our Presentation Day assemblies this year.
- Dancing and music is allowed indoors or outdoors in class cohorts.
- Excursions and Incursions No Term 4 reward excursions have been approved so our end of year party days will occur at school. While this is disappointing, we have some great fun activities planned for our students. Incursions can occur and therefore our Year 6 Big Day in will still go ahead.
- Transitions and Orientations can go ahead as long as they are designed to minimise mingling of cohorts. Our 2022 families have received information about our K Start program which commences next Wednesday. Our Year 6 students will receive information about High School transition as soon as it becomes available to us. This is a much more difficult task for our high school to coordinate several Primary schools.

Year 6 End of Year Changes

Unfortunately, due to the conditions of the Public Health Order, we cannot hold our Year 6 Farewell at the Gosford RSL as planned, so we will be holding our Year 6 Farewell at school on **Wednesday 8th December**. Please note change of date, which was also unavoidable. More information will be sent home closer to the date from your class teachers, but we wanted to let you know the change of date and venue as soon as possible. Wednesday 8th December is also our school's Presentation Day however, our 3-6 Assembly will be held in the morning.

Our Year 6 graduation assembly will be held on **Thursday 9th December** as planned but will take place during school time from 1:55pm to 2:55pm. As parents are unable to attend, it is easier to hold during school time. We will hopefully be able to live stream this assembly. Students will wear full school uniform.

Student attendance at school

All students are expected to be at school unless they are unwell. Do not attend school if unwell, even with mild symptoms. Get tested for COVID-19 and follow NSW Health directions. If students have any COVID-19 symptoms they will be sent home and must not return to school unless they have either:

- isolated for 10 days, when no medical certificate is available
- a negative COVID-19 test result and are symptom free

In circumstances where a student has other medical reasons for recurrent symptoms, a letter from your GP is sufficient to negate the requirement for a negative test.

2022 Enrolments – new arrivals and families leaving

The school is currently accepting enrolments for 2022. If you know of families intending who are moving into the area, please let them know to phone the office. Alternatively we now have online enrolments available via our website. If you are looking at moving away from the area in 2022, could you also please contact the office so that we are aware of any changes when planning for our 2022 classes.

NATIONAL BULLYING PREVENTION WEEK, 15-19 NOVEMBER, 2021

Definition

Bullying behaviour has three key features. It involves the intentional misuse of power in a relationship. It is **ongoing and repeated**, and it involves behaviours that can cause harm. Having a disagreement with a friend, or a single incident or argument is <u>not</u> defined as bullying. These behaviours may be upsetting, and should be resolved, but they are not bullying.

Resources

The NSW Government anti-bullying website (see: https://antibullying.nsw.gov.au/) provides evidence-based resources and information for schools, parents and carers, and students.

We encourage all parents and carers to visit the website to support our whole-school prevention, early intervention and response approaches and strategies for managing bullying behaviour.

School culture and inclusion

Our school rejects all forms of bullying behaviours, including online (or cyber) bullying by maintaining a commitment to providing a safe, inclusive and respectful learning community that promotes student wellbeing. All staff are committed to establishing evidence-based approaches and strategies that promote a positive climate where bullying is less likely to occur.

All members of the school community are active participants in building a welcoming school culture that values diversity and fosters positive relationships. A key component of a supportive school culture is building respectful relationships and an ethos that bullying is not accepted in any form, including bullying behaviour towards any student, staff member or parent/carer.

Partnerships with families and community

Effective schools have high levels of parental and community involvement. This involvement is strongly related to improved student learning, attendance and behaviour. Our school proactively builds collaborative relationships with families and communities to create a shared understanding of how to support student learning, safety and wellbeing.

Together we can teach our children to make positive choices, develop resilience and manage conflict in an appropriate and acceptable manner and to seek help when needed.

Throughout the coming week, teachers will be working with students to identify the many forms of bullying, to discuss the way in which bullying behaviour affects others and to help students develop strategies to address and minimise bullying incidents in a proactive and safe manner.


GAME CHANGER CHALLENGE

What is the Game Changer Challenge?

Entering its fourth year, the design thinking challenge is open to all 2,200+ public schools across the state and centres on exploring solutions for a real-world, wicked problem.

Our wicked problem: Humans have unlimited needs, but the planet has limited capacity to satisfy them.

In term 2, five teams of students at Niagara Park Public School submitted their solutions to the wicked problem and out of 600 teams, 96 were selected to compete in the Virtual Heats. On Monday, Niagara Park Public School Mind Legends competed in the Virtual Heats for the Game Changer Challenge. The Niagara Park Public School Mind Legends worked hard as a team to solve the wicked problem and present their solution to a panel of judges. Whilst we didn't win, our students had a lot of fun working together.
