Atttendance

As part of the Premiers Priorities, all schools need to meet an attendance target. Our target to meet by the end of this year is to have 79.4% of our students attending school 90% of the time or more. That means, to have no more than 4 days absent each term. We currently have 69.4% of our students achieving this target. We are asking for your help to ensure that your child/ren attends school every day they are physically able to do so. Of course, we understand that when students are sick, they need to stay at home but we believe that having no more than 4 days absent each term is possible.

Confidentiality When Dealing With Conflicts

From time to time, our students have conflict with each other. We encourage our students to report incidents or issues to the teacher on the day it has happened so that we can follow up immediately. From time to time, students report issues to parents rather than the class teacher. In these situations, we ask that you redirect your child to report the problem to the class teacher the following day. Alternatively, we ask that you report it to the class teacher as soon as you hear about it. At no time are you, as parents, to approach another student to address your concerns.

Once reported, we ask that you trust that it will be followed up and understand that we may not get back to you with the follow up, as we rely on our students to report back to you. At no time can we discuss consequences for another child with you due to privacy laws. When dealing with issues, we listen to all sides and make judgements based on evidence presented to us by the students involved and witnesses. When consequences are required, we follow our school discipline policy as well as Department guidelines. We thank parents who trust us to follow up and know that we will do so with discretion and fairness.
