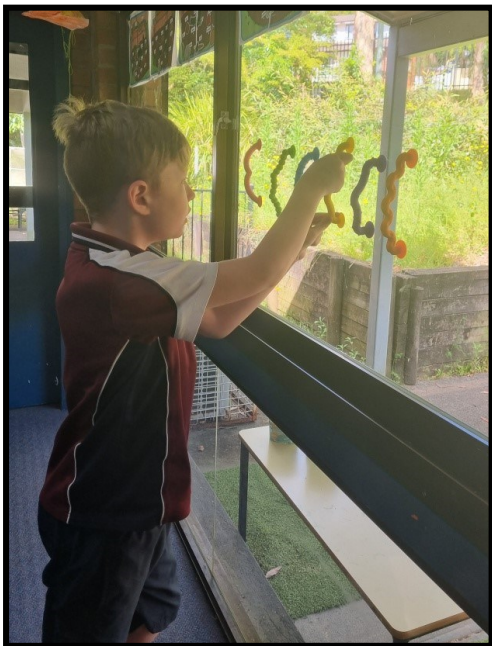
Thank you to our wonderful students for so much enthusiasm and their amazing behaviour. A big thank you to our families for coming along and joining in, it was a brilliant morning.

Is your child interested in joining the school band?

The school band is now taking enrolments for 2023 and is open to all students currently in years 2-5.

No prior experience needed!

What do you need to do?

Complete an online [Expression of Interest](https://www.teachingservices.com.au/EOI) form. Your child will then be able to meet with a music teacher at school to determine to which instrument they may be best suited.

More detailed information will then be sent home, prior to online enrolment for 2023.

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School Band Program

Dear Parents,

Today your child attended a demonstration showcasing the instruments available to learn at school in 2023. If you would like more information please register your interest using the link or QR code below within the next 5 days.

Once you have registered your child's interest TSA will then conduct instrument trials at school to help your child discover which instrument they are most suited to (this will take place within strict COVID-safe guidelines). Following the instrument trials, an *Enrolment Pack* will be sent home with your child. This will contain more detailed information about the school band program along with the result of their instrument trial.



Band Program Structure

Rehearsal (all students work together in a full band setting)

- Once a week, generally before or after school, for 30-60 minutes

Tuition (students work in small groups or individually to learn new skills)

- 30min per week, at school, usually on the same day as rehearsal

Students attend both rehearsal and tuition at school. Regular practise at home (3-4 times a week) is essential.

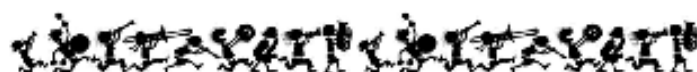
Band Program Costs

Tuition Fees: small group tuition and band rehearsal costs \$210 (plus \$10 resource levy) per term. Individual tuition costs extra and is not available at all schools.

Instrument: students require their own instrument. TSA sells quality new instruments, offers 'rent-to-buy' (starting at \$43 per month) and has an excellent selection of second hand instruments in near-new condition.

Accessories: students are provided with a workbook upon enrolment but may require other accessories, generally less than \$50 per year.

Expression of Interest

How to register your child's interest in the band

Simply provide your child's name, class and school along with your contact email and phone number and TSA will include them in instrument trials at school. There is no commitment required and the online form will take less than a minute to complete.



- Open your smartphone camera app and point the camera at the QR code. Your device will recognise the QR code and shows a notification. Tap the notification and you will be taken to the online *Expression Of Interest* form.

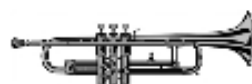

*A 5-step evidence-based psychological first aid framework (TAR3) for you to follow when responding 'in the moment' to episodes of distress and behavioural challenges. TAR3 is unique to EquiEnergy Youth and can be likened to the 'DR ABC' process for responding to medical first aid.

*Guidance on simple ways you can help young people build coping, resilience and positive help seeking behaviour and the vital role you play in promoting this.

*Context on why child & adolescent mental health occurs and what you can do to improve mental health outcomes for the young people you support.

*Coaching in the use of scripts and engagement strategies to adopt when responding to distress using the TAR3 Psychological First Aid Method.
