National Assessment Program - Literacy & Numeracy (NAPLAN)

Over the past week, our students have been completing practice tests in class to prepare themselves for the online format.

SUPERSTAR PROCESSES REVAMP

After feedback from staff and students last year, it was evident that our Superstar processes needed a few minor changes to ensure consistency across the school. Our Superstar stickers and certificates are designed to reward those students who always work hard and do the right thing by ensuring that they are noticed and acknowledged.

Survey feedback showed the need for clearer guidelines on the awarding of Superstar stickers, as some staff were unable to clearly articulate the guidelines for giving a Superstar sticker and some students were unable to articulate the expectations for receiving a Superstar sticker. With our newly defined guidelines in place and aligned to our new Class Dojo system, it was further identified the need to introduce an additional two Superstar Certificate levels in anticipation that students will be rewarded more frequently, and therefore move through the levels at a faster pace.

The new Certificates and corresponding rewards are as follows:

- 1 Star Certificate
- 2 Star Certificate & school badge
- 3 Star Certificate & school pen
- 4 Star Certificate & \$5.00 Canteen voucher
- 5 Star Certificate & book voucher
- 6 Star Certificate, book & \$5.00 Canteen voucher
- 7 Star Certificate & Bronze Superstar medal
- 8 Star Certificate & Silver Superstar medal
- 9 Star Certificate & Gold Superstar medal
- 10 Star Certificate, lunch with Principal & a chosen friend & name on the Honour Board

The new criteria for awarding Superstar stickers is outlined below:

- Earning mid-term reward participation =1 Superstar
- Earning end of term reward participation =1 Superstar
- Having earned 50+ dojos more than what is required to participate in the end of term reward = 1 extra Superstar sticker (2 in total)
- Exemplary assembly behaviour (all staff hand out one Superstar sticker each at assemblies)
- Completed Reading Logs =1 Superstar sticker for each 100 nights reading
- Completed Premier's Reading Challenge <u>=1 Superstar sticker</u>
- Completed Summer Reading is a Blast =1 Superstar sticker

One Superstar sticker may also be awarded for the following:

- Demonstration of citizenship (ie. for going out of their way to help/encourage others unasked)
- Outstanding quality work (ie. above and beyond peers)
- Outstanding improvement/achievement (ie. beyond their personal best)
- Achieving a goal in writing/reading/other identified personal goals
- Outstanding helpfulness, work or achievement as identified by another staff member or student
- Whole term commitment to extra-curricular activities (ie. Green Team, Choir)



EOIs must be received by COB, Friday 31st March 2023. The maximum numbers of students for the camp is 80.


