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National Reconciliation Week 2023

National Reconciliation Week commences on Sorry Day, 26th May every year and ends on 3rd June (Eddie Mabo Day). Last Friday our students participated in discussions and activities around the mistreatment of First Nations people. This week our students continued these discussions and activities in their classrooms about what Reconciliation means and how we can be a part of building respectful relationships between our school community and Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples. We all have a role to play when it comes to reconciliation, and in playing our part we collectively build relationships and communities that value Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander sentences.



National Reconciliation Week (NRW) is a time for all Australians to learn about our shared histories, cultures, and achievements, and to explore how each of us can contribute to achieving reconciliation in Australia. This year's theme for National Reconciliation Week 2023 is "Be a Voice for Generations". Keep up the momentum for change. The theme encourages all Australians to be a voice for reconciliation in tangible ways in our everyday lives – where we live, work and socialise. For the work of generations past, and the benefit of generations future, act today for a more just, equitable and reconciled country for all (Reconciliation Australia).

Eddie Mabo - Mabo Day is marked annually on 3rd June. It commemorates Mer Island man Eddie Koiki Mabo and his successful efforts to overturn the legal fiction of terra nullius, or 'land belonging to no-one'. The Mabo case, led by Eddie Koiki Mabo, an activist for the 1967 Referendum, fought the legal concept that Australia and the Torres Strait Islands were not owned by Indigenous peoples because they did not 'use' the land in ways Europeans believed constituted some kind of legal possession.

Despite the fact that Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples occupied the land, spoke their own languages and had their own laws and customs before the British arrived in 1788, 'Terra nullis' was an attempt to give 'legitimacy' for the British and Australian governments to allow the dispossession of all Indigenous peoples of their land.

Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people also had – and continue to have – a strong connection to 'Country' – the Australian land.

National Reconciliation Week -27 May to 3 June - is a time for all Australians to learn about our shared histories, cultures, and achievements, and to explore how each of us can contribute to achieving reconciliation in Australia.

Compulsory School Attendance

What are my legal responsibilities?

Education in New South Wales is compulsory for all children between the ages of six years and below the minimum school leaving age of 17 years. The Education Act 1990 requires that parents ensure their children of compulsory school age are enrolled at, and regularly attend school, or, are registered with the NSW Education and Standards Authority for home schooling. Once enrolled, children are required to attend school each day it is open for students.





What if my child has to be away from school? On occasion, your child may need to be absent from school. Justified reasons for student absences may include:

- being sick, or having an infectious disease
- having an unavoidable medical appointment
- being required to attend a recognised religious holiday
- exceptional or urgent family circumstance (e.g. attending a funeral)

Following an absence from school you must ensure that within 7 days you provide your child's school with a verbal or written explanation for the absence.

How can I explain my child's absence at Niagara Park Public School?

- You will receive a text message on the day your child is absent. If you reply to the text message your child's absence will be explained. Please note if you have multiple children away on the day, you will need to include all children's names in the reply, so each child's absence is explained. If they are away for multiple days you will need to respond each day or include the dates in the message.
- Send in a written note to your child's classroom teacher.
- Phone the school and let the office staff know.
- Send a message to the classroom teacher on Sentral Parent app.
- Lodge an absence through the Sentral Parent app.
- If you don't explain your child's absence, you will receive a reminder note from school. Please return the tear off slip within 7 days to explain your child's absence.

At Niagara Park Public School we recognise that working collaboratively with students and their families is the best way to support the regular attendance of students at school. We look forward to working in partnership with you to support your child to fulfil their life opportunities.
