TEACHING AND LEARNING PROGRAMS

To provide students with a broad and balanced education, the curriculum is defined in terms of seven Key Learning Areas as outlined below.

- **English** This includes guided reading sessions, spelling, guided and independent writing, handwriting, grammar, speaking and listening activities
- Mathematics A curriculum based program using the Prime Maths program
- **History** Includes a unit on 'The Past in the Present'
- Geography Includes a unit on 'Features of Places'
- Science Including units 'Earth and Space and The Material World'
- Creative Arts Students participate in activities involving music, visual arts, dance and drama
- <u>Personal Development/Health/Physical Education (PD/H/PE)</u> During these lessons various fundamental gross motor skills i.e., running, catching, balancing etc are developed in PE. Health covers a variety of topics including making healthy choices and knowledge and understanding of self and relationships. PD focuses on developing skills and attitudes to support students' overall emotional development.

Information Research and Technology

Students will attend two one-hour sessions in our Information Research Centre every week. One is a Library focused lesson and the other is a technology based lesson. These lessons will be taken by Mrs Sinclair, Mrs Frost, Miss Ross and Mrs. Clarke.

SPORT

Sport day for Stage 1 is on **Tuesday.** The students will need to wear joggers and hat on this day and bring a water bottle.

2/3H sport day will be on Thursday.

HOMEWORK

Homework promotes independent work habits and organisational skills and consolidates class work. Homework consists of daily home reading, high frequency word learning and a homework grid that covers all learning areas. Homework is given out on Monday and must be returned by Friday.

ATTENDANCE

This is compulsory and appointments in school hours should be avoided if possible. If a student is away for any reason, a note should be sent <u>on the day the child returns to school</u>, giving a reason for the absence.

It is important that students are at school by 8:55am. In Stage 1 the first lesson commences as soon as the students enter the room. If a child is continually arriving late, they are missing vital learning. Repeated absences/late arrivals are questioned by the Department of Education Home School Liaison Officer who monitors our rolls. Please be aware teachers do not begin morning playground duty until **8:30am.** No student should be at school before this time.
